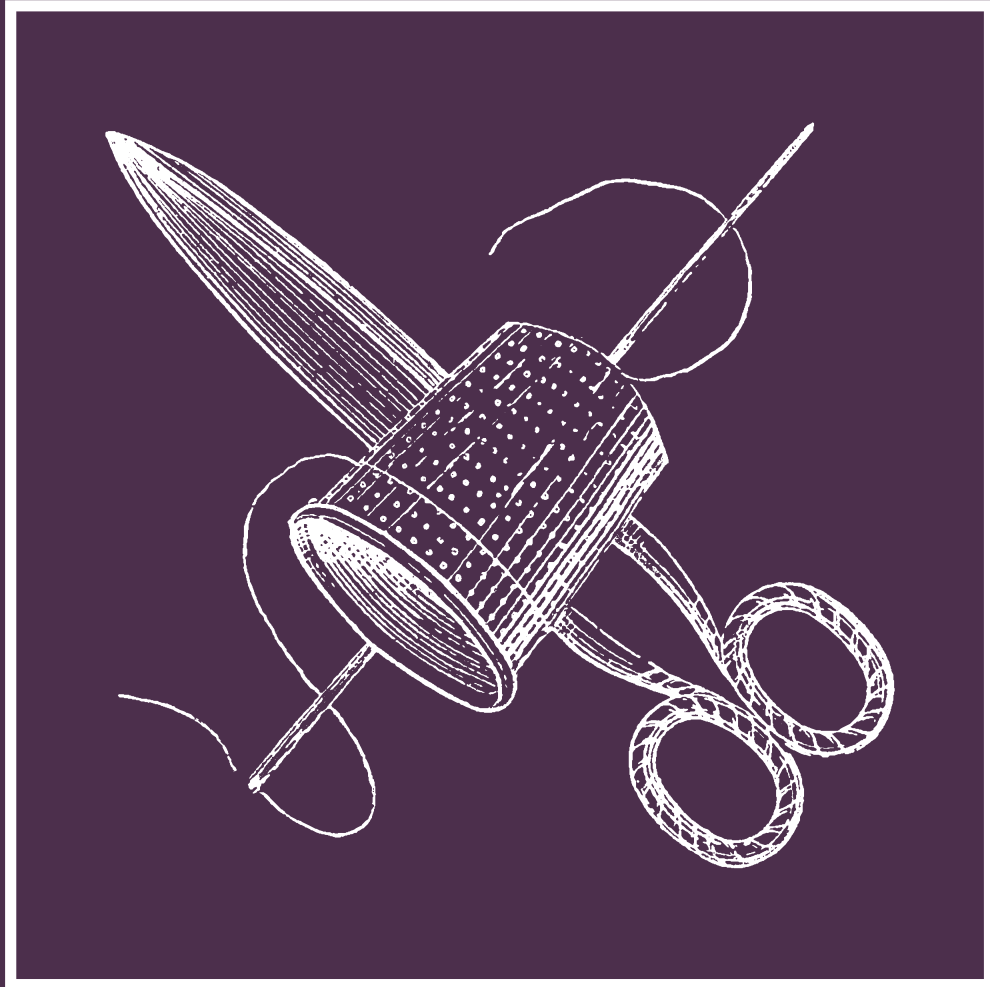

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

This workshop will provide participants an opportunity to take a closer look at some of the most fundamental strategies we can use when working with the DeafBlind community. Participants will discuss the differences they may encounter when working with the DeafBlind community compared to the general Deaf community. They will investigate and discuss a number of misconceptions about working with the DeafBlind community and consider the varied needs of DeafBlind consumers.
