

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

This workshop will encourage participants to join in a discussion about various topics related to working in the DeafBlind community. It will offer an opportunity for participants to identify specific physical and mental tools interpreters should have at the ready when working in the DeafBlind community as well as specific vocabulary that should be used when working with DeafBlind consumers. Finally, this workshop will guide interpreters through the impact COVID has had on the relationships and working conditions among the DeafBlind and interpreting community.
