EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

This is an eight-week series. **Participants must attend ALL eight sessions to receive 1.2 PS RID CEUs.** At the end of the series participants will be able to:

- Record and analyze an ASL and English text using one of the six process models.
- Create a diagram of the Gish model and describe how it helps outline an ASL or English message.
- Compare two process models and explain how these models enhance message analysis skills and improve accuracy of interpretations.
- Recognize three triggers that cause individual cognitive process breakdowns.
- Formulate a plan for managing cognitive overload when interpreting.
- Name and demonstrate three ASL handshape parameters.
- Restate and correctly demonstrate four ways an ASL message uses non-markers.
- Demonstrate the correct use of four ASL classifiers.
- Use at least three online resources for English to ASL definitions and sign equivalences.
- Identify two strategies for defining and incorporating new signs into their working ASL-to-English vocabulary.
- Investigate and outline six testing strategies.
- Develop a plan to help eliminate testing anxiety.
- Locate the RID Code of Professional Conduct and Ethical Practice System.
- Evaluate various interpreting scenarios, identify ethical dilemmas, and apply at least five different tenets from the CPC.

DESCRIPTION

This workshop series will offer recent ITP graduates, and non-certified individuals seeking certification, an opportunity to enhance their skills and learn to apply their knowledge of interpreting as they venture into the profession. Participants will evaluate their current skill set and develop strategies to continue honing them using proven, researched interpreting models. They will investigate specific topics such as ethics and business practices. Finally, participants will engage in discussions about testing, and different disciplines in the field with seasoned, certified professionals.

During this series there will be four guest lecturers. Tanya Timmerman, Jamie Hunerjager, Dr Sabrina Smith and Stephanie Rotheram, educators, professionals and experts in our field. They will share their linguistic knowledge, discuss testing strategies, and provide valuable resources for enhancing vocabulary, both English and ASL.
