## DESCRIPTION

Are you preparing to take the CASLI Generalist Knowledge Exam (CGKE)? Do you have your test date on the calendar? Are you thinking about scheduling your test date? PERFECT!! Rebekah has taken and passed the newest version of the CGKE and is excited to share with you all she learned about navigating the registration process, strategies she used for preparing for the exam, and tips for reducing test anxiety.

This workshop will be presented in sign language and will focus on the Fundamentals of Interpreting and the Ethics and Cultural Responsiveness portions of the exam. These two portions of the exam are the same for both Deaf and Hearing candidates. During this workshop, participants will have an opportunity to navigate the CASLI website, walk through the format of the exams, discuss ethical scenarios, ask questions, and compile a list of preparatory resources. Participants will leave this workshop with a better sense of how to prepare for the CGKE and what to expect when they walk into a testing center. This session mentions, but does not focus on, the Generalist Performance Exam.

## OBJECTIVES

Participants will be able to:

- Identify the three parts of the new CASLI Generalist Exam process.
- List at least five interpreting related tasks the exam assumes a candidate can perform in order to meet the needs of consumers and the community.
- Recognize the four basic domains of an interpreting encounter outlined in the exam.
- Outline three strategies for approaching the ethical decision making portion of the exam.
- Consider four potential topics that will require candidates' demonstration of cultural competence.
- Identify at least four resources that help candidates prepare for both the knowledge and ethics portions of the CASLI exam.
