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OBJECTIVES


- Identify the three components of the “ideal team player”, in themselves and in an ASL/ENG teaming situation.
- Apply the RID Code of Professional Conduct, specifically Tenets 2.0 and 4.0, to each of the categories described in the Ideal Team Player scenario.
- Apply Lencioni’s concept of, “Humble, Hungry, and Smart” to three ethical scenarios commonly experienced in the field of interpreting.

DESCRIPTION

Have you ever been asked how you would respond to a certain scenario involving a consumer and responded with, “Well, it depends...?” In this workshop, participants will analyze three components from the book *The Ideal Team Player* by Patrick M. Lencioni, to answer this question.

Participants will discuss how these components can help them navigate ethically and confidently through the maze of challenges they face, in the interpreting world today, while maintaining personal integrity. In addition, they will apply the three components to the RID CPC, and review ethical scenarios commonly experienced.
